

KPI Information Update IU-83-2015 (Security certificate of proficiency coming into force as of 1st July 2015)

Port state control inspections under Regulation I/4 of International Convention on **Standards** of Training, Certification and Watchkeeping for Seafarers 1978, as amended, unless there be clear grounds are limited to verification that all seafarers serving on board who are required to be certificated hold appropriate certificates, a valid dispensation or documentary proof that an application for an endorsement has been submitted Administration the accordance with Regulation I/10, paragraph 5.

Modified by Manila amendments 2010, every seafarer serving on board shall hold one of the original security certificates of proficiency required under Regulations VI/5 or VI/6 of the convention as of 1st July 2015.i.e.

✓ Ship Security Officer Certificates:

For those seafarers nominated to perform Ship Security Officer's function on board.

✓ Security Awareness Training Certificate:

For those seafarers not assigned specific security duties as per Ship Security Plan (SSP).

✓ Certificate for those seafarers having designated security duties:

In accordance with Ship Security Plan (SSP).
